What is CPoS?

- Banner's Course Program of Study (CPoS) functionality is used by CT State to demonstrate a compliance requirement that specifies Title IV funds may only be applied to courses that are within a student's eligible program of study (34 CFR 668.2(b)).
- While this is a financial aid compliance requirement, the CPoS process is dependent on:
 - The accuracy of the curriculum defined in Degree Works.
 - Course pre-reqs, equivalencies & attributes as programmed in the OCB Catalog




Why Has CT State Implemented CPoS?

- CPoS is used to meet a federal compliance requirement that indicates only courses that count directly toward a student's program of study can be counted toward a student's enrollment level, which is used to determine financial aid eligibility.
- This change not only pertains to financial aid, but also helps ensure that students are progressing toward completing their program in a timely manner.




CPoS Workflow

What is our Role in CPoS?



Academic Affairs

- Advise to the CT State curriculum
- CCS 1001 exemption: Legacy courses and TR credit
- Course substitutions must be processed along with the student registering, to avoid CPOS alerts being raised.
- Blanket substitutions can be programmed to allow for legacy courses to apply to course requirements for legacy students.
- Courses will count as open electives only if the spot is open on the Degree Works audit.



Guided Pathways Advising

- CPOS alerts are generated nightly in CRM Advise and are designed to notify advisors about potential issues with their advisee's courses/program.
- Guided Pathways Advisors are primarily responsible for investigating CPOS alerts and following up with their students as necessary to address the alert(s).
- Resolutions to addressing CPOS alerts include but are not limited to: adjusting student course schedules, changing academic programs, and/or seeking appropriate substitutions.



Enrollment Services

- Each campus One Stop Enrollment Center (OSEC) can help students navigate registration in myCTState.
- OSEC can help students review their schedule/program in myCTState and connect with their advisor if needed.
- Ensure program of study updates are processed for the appropriate semester/term.
- OSEC may assist in clearing CPoS alerts.



Degree Works

- Degree Works (DW) is the tool which reflects the curriculum for CT State.
- If Degree Works does not match the catalog, please email <u>CTState-DegreeWorks@ct.edu</u>
- Courses can be moved within the audit.
- No overrides in SFASCRE because of pending substitutions.



Transfer Credit Evaluation

- Transfer credit evaluations are performed for accepted degree and/or certificate seeking students based on their *current degree program*.
- The Transcript Credit Evaluation (TCE) team can confirm receipt of a student's official college transcript and status of a transcript credit evaluation.
