	Observational log form with documented time in physical therapy settings. (See last Admission Requirement below.)

	2.5 PTA GPA – Based only on the completed college courses with grades that meet the PTA admission requirements. The PTA GPA is a calculation specific to PTA applicants and may differ from the college GPA.		
	ATI TEAS (nursing or allied health version) with Adjusted Individual Total Score of 60% or higher completed within the last 3 years. (Aug 1, 2022 or later). Go to <i>www.atitesting.com</i> for testing schedules and registration information. Applicants may take this test multiple times. Official scores must be submitted by the application deadline. Highest score is used for ranking.

Curriculum Sequence

A positive drug screen may prevent a student from continuing in the program. Those with a positive background check may be excluded from clinical sites and may not be able to meet the competencies required for the program. Clinical Education Experiences: Clinical learning is held at a variety of healthcare sites throughout Connecticut (CT) and these clinical sites are assigned at the discretion of the PTA faculty. Students may be required to travel over seventy- five (75) minutes to their experiences. Students are required to provide their own transportation, living expenses (as necessary), and any other expenses while on clinical education experiences.
