

DENTAL ASSISTANT

Dental assistant students acquire the skills and knowledge necessary through the combination of a science and clinically based curriculum to become Certified Dental Assistants (CDA) as integral members of a dental health team.

The Dental Assistant certificate program helps students gain the knowledge and skills needed to obtain employment as a dental assistants in general or specialty practices or public health clinics. Graduates will be prepared to assist during procedures, expose dental radiographs, and perform laboratory procedures and front office duties. At CT State Manchester, students practice clinical procedures in an on-site, state-of-the-art dental office setting that includes three treatment rooms complete with digital x-ray, electronic patient records and an instrument processing area.

Graduates of the Dental Assistant program have the training and clinical practice necessary to begin a satisfying career in dental medicine.
