MAMMOGRAPHY | MRI | CT

CT State Community College, Middlesex's Mammography, Computed Tomography (CT), and Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) programs are designed to prepare certified Radiographers for immediate employment in the workplace in hospitals, clinics, and medical offices.

DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAMS AND LICENSURES

MAMMOGRAPHY

The Mammography Certificate program is a one-semester program for certified Radiographers interested in a career as a Mammographer. Following the successful completion of all Program requirements and obligations to the college, students are awarded a Certificate of Completion in Mammography and may sit for the professional Registry exam sponsored by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT). A minimum score of 75 on the national post-primary certification examination is required for national certification as a Mammographer.

MAGNETIC RESONANCE IMAGING (MRI)


The Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) Certificate program is a two-semester program designed to prepare certified imaging professionals registered with the ARRT in Radiography, Nuclear Medicine (NMTCB is also accepted), Radiation Therapy, or Sonography (ARDMS is also accepted) for immediate employment in the workplace as MRI Technologists in hospitals, clinics, and medical offices. Following the successful completion of all Program requirements and obligations to the college, students are awarded a Certificate of Completion in Magnetic Resonance Imaging and may sit for the professional Registry exam sponsored by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT). A minimum score of 75 on the national post-primary certification examination is required.

COMPUTED TOMOGRAPHY (CT)

The Computed Tomography (CT) Certificate program is a two-semester program for certified Radiographers and Radiation Therapists interested in a career as a CT Technologist. Following the successful completion of all Program requirements and obligations to the college, students are awarded a Certificate of Completion in Computed Tomography and may sit for the professional Registry exam sponsored by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT). A minimum score of 75 on the national post-primary certification examination is required for national certification as a Computed Tomographer.
