Criteria will include type of program planned, anticipated participants within and beyond department or program, and anticipated outcomes The CFT also hopes to sponsor programs from varied areas of the College.

Please note that funds are intended at this time for departmental or program projects rather than individual projects. Funds may be requested for such ends as inviting a speaker, purchasing materials to be used for professional development (such as copies of a book for a discussion series), or hosting a professional development activity. Note, however, that while funding might be requested for a speaker, someone from within the community college system would not be eligible for a stipend.
