The Center for Educational Services provides academic services in the form of tutoring and academic assessment. Services are accessible and free to all CT State students. Students enrolled in courses at the college may receive free tutoring. Tutoring is available in select subject areas: math, sciences, English as a Second Language (ESL), accounting and more. Tutoring is not on a one-to-one ratio; however, small groups are also offered the opportunity to book multiple sessions daily and weekly. Students can contact the tutoring center to inquire about specific subject areas. Tutoring is only available on a full schedule during the spring and fall semesters with limited availability during the summer semesters. Students can sign up for a tutor in the CES. Tutoring is available in S205 or N400. Testing offered by CES: Accuplacer (LOEP), ALEKS PPL, English Placement, Languages & Culture Placement and Make-up Test for Faculty. CLEP, ATI TEAS TEST and distance proctoring with a cost of \$15 for CT State students and \$35 for other institutions.
