What is the Honors Program?

- 2-year program
 - * 1.5-year option
- Cohort-based
- Supplements any degree program
- More rigorous course work
- Special programming



Required coursework

- * CCS 1001H*
- ENG 1010H or ENG 1020H
- At least 1 other honors course (PSY 1011H, several history courses, under development: COMM 1301H and ENVE 1010H)
- Capstone project

*Only required if student starts program as first semester freshman **Any honors course can be replaced with an "honors by contract" course.

Special Features

- Personalized faculty advising including for transfer
- Close interface with college administration
- Leadership opportunities
- Opportunity to take courses at four-year institutions at no cost
- Automatic acceptance into honors programs at four-year institutions in CT
- Special programming
- Field trips

Programming to improve academic and professional success

- Workshops
 - Critical thinking
 - Leadership skills

Demographics of Honors Program students

- Gender: 48% of honors students are female compared to 58% of non-honors students*
- Minority: 30% of honors students are non-white compared to 34% of non-honors students*

Outcomes: Retention and graduation

- * Higher Fall to Fall retention rates compared to non-honors students (77% vs. 54%)*
- * Higher graduation rates compared to nonhonors students (46% vs. 18%)*

Outcomes: Transfer with scholarships

- Most Honors students transfer to 4-year institutions including:
 - Wesleyan University
 - Muhlenberg College
 - Yale University
- Nearly all receive substantial scholarships
 - e.g., Etherington Scholars at Wesleyan University

- High school guidance counselors
- Letter sent to all eligible students upon application to CT State
- GPA referrals
- Professor recommendations

Admission by application

- Application at ctstate.edu/honors
- Application reviewed by Honors Program coordinator
- Letters of recommendation
- Essay
- High school transcript
- Test scores if available
- Minimum stats:
 - * 3.25 GPA <u>or</u>

 - \$ 500+ Reading/Writing AND 500+ Math SAT

Requirements to remain in Honors Program

- Minimum 3.25 GPA
- Pass Capstone course

Advising prospective Honors Program students

- If encounter a new student who is eligible or a strong continuing student
 - email Honors Program coordinator and advise the student to as well
 - Students can apply to the Honors Program on any campus regardless of home campus
- Ensure that GPAs and faculty on your campus are aware of Honors Program option

Honors by contract courses

- Student completes paperwork (at <u>www.ctstate.edu/honors</u>) with professor and Honors Program coordinator by 3rd week of semester
 - discretion of professor
- Student must earn a B or higher in the course in order to earn honors credit for the course
