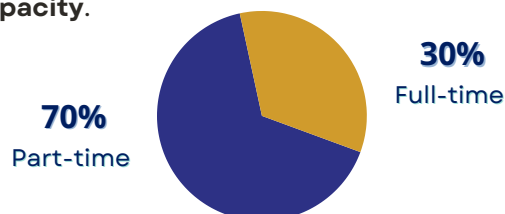


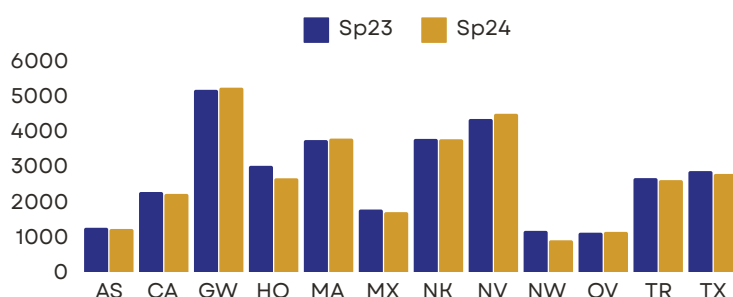

CT State students are registered for **283,539 credit hours**, representing **18,903 full-time equivalents (FTEs)** occupying **89,693 seats** and filling available sections to **76% capacity**.

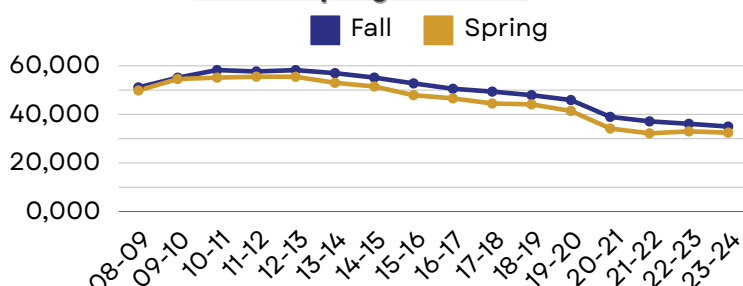


Credit Headcount Enrollment by Campus



CT State **FTE enrollment was up 2%** from Sp23 and headcount only down -0.1% (-44) compared to last year's deduplicated total. **The decline in student total was negligible** and the increase in FTE suggests **students are attempting more credits this semester**.

CT State Community College Undergraduate Headcount Enrollment Fall and Spring Semesters

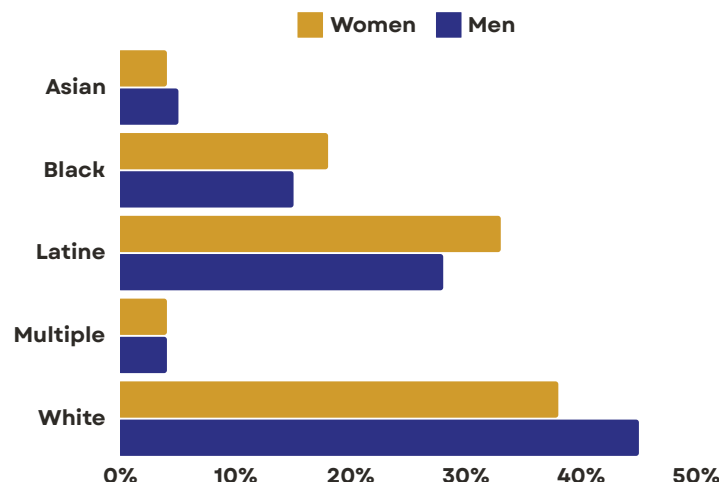


Student Types

Improvement in retention rates pushed continuing and readmitted students counts up by 5% and are 86% of CT State's Sp24 population. New, first-time students remained steady at 6% of students. Transfer-in students represent 5% of enrollment. This decrease from Sp23 is driven by redefining intercampus transfers as continuing students. High-schoolers are 3% of CT State's Sp24 students.

Race/Ethnicity by Gender

60% of CT State students are women. The proportion of women is consistent from Sp23 to Sp24.



Compared to Sp23, CT State's White student population decreased by 2%. The percent of Asian, Black, and Multiracial student populations remained stable at 5%, 17% and 4% respectively. 31% of students identify as Latine, an increase of 2%, suggesting that **CT State will be eligible for the federal Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI) designation** in the future.

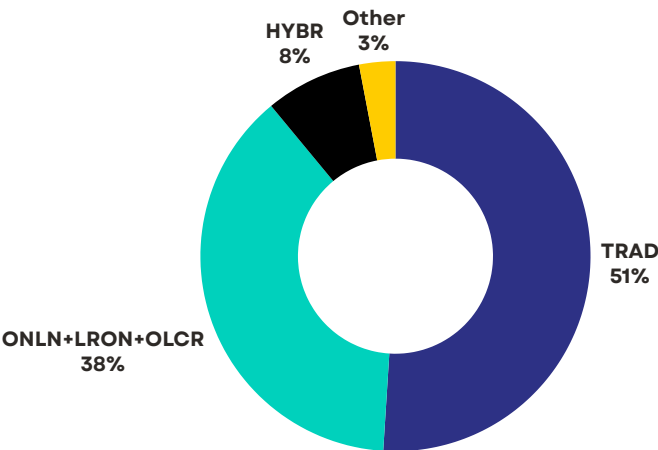

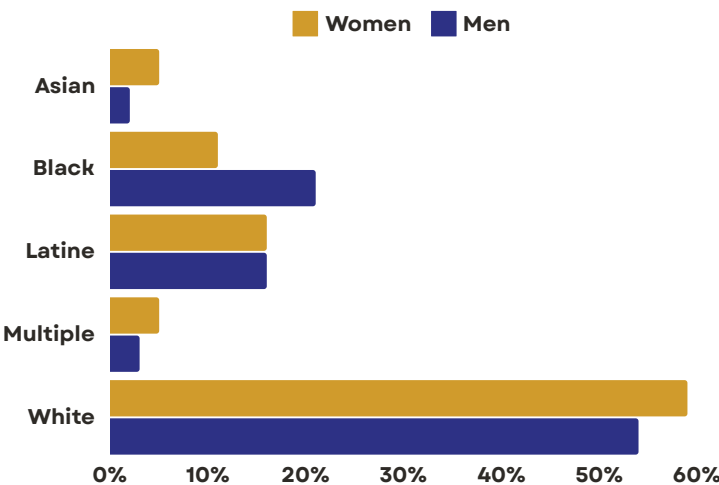

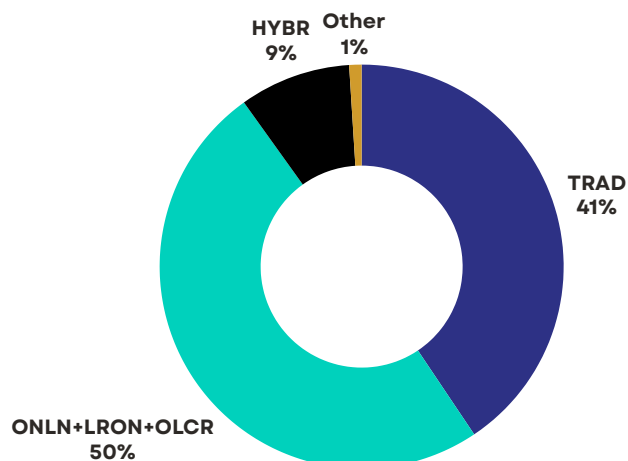

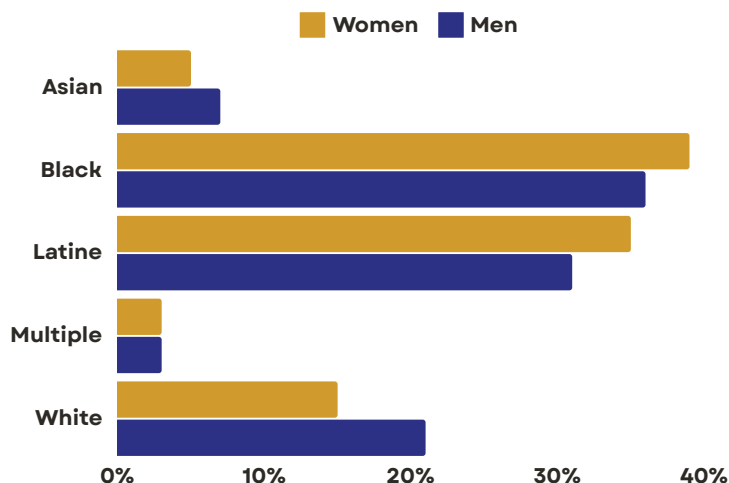

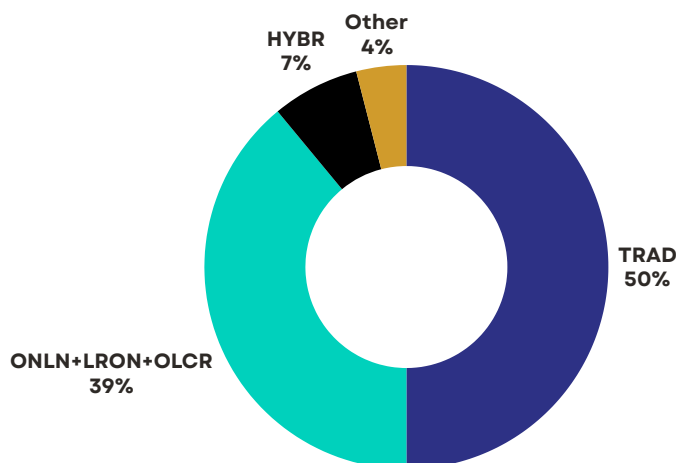

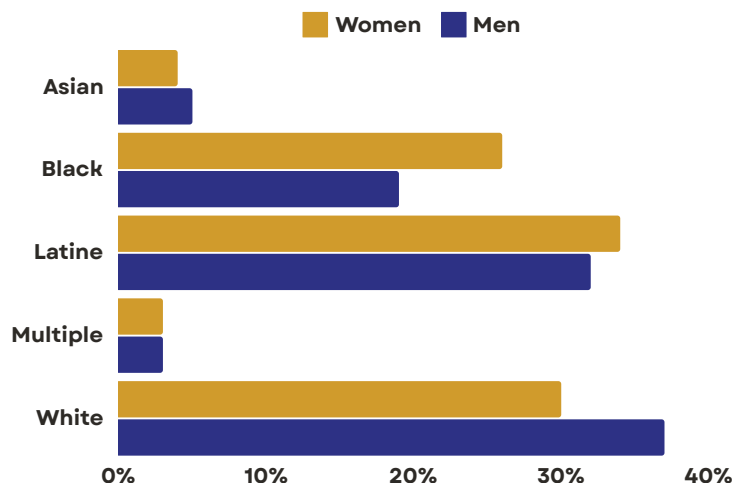

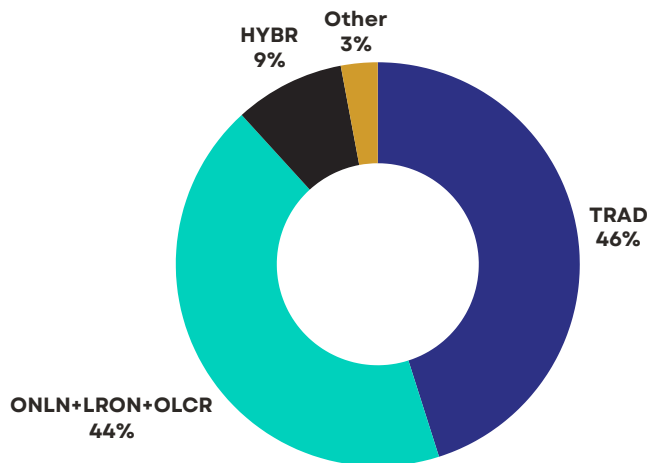

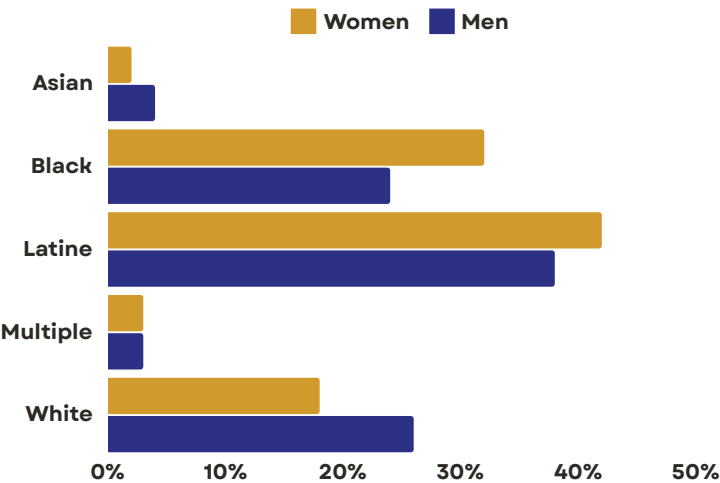

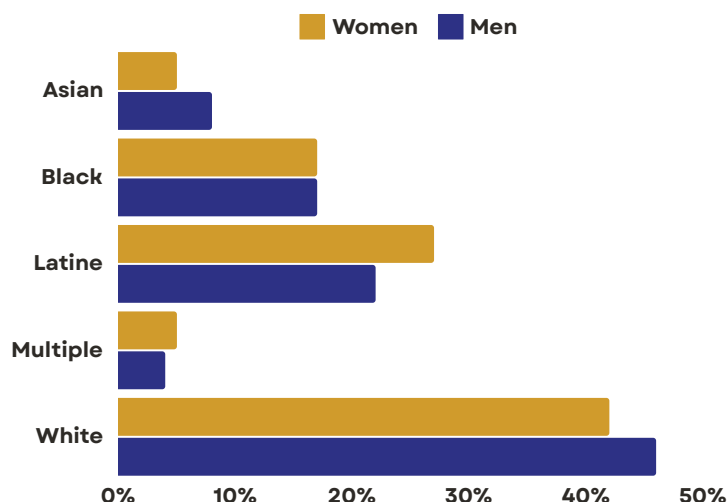

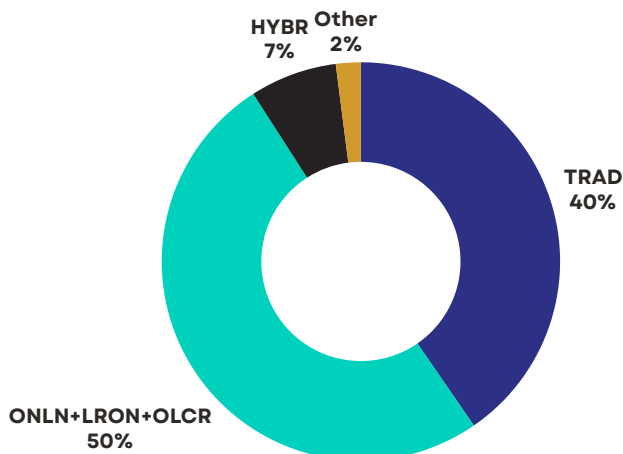

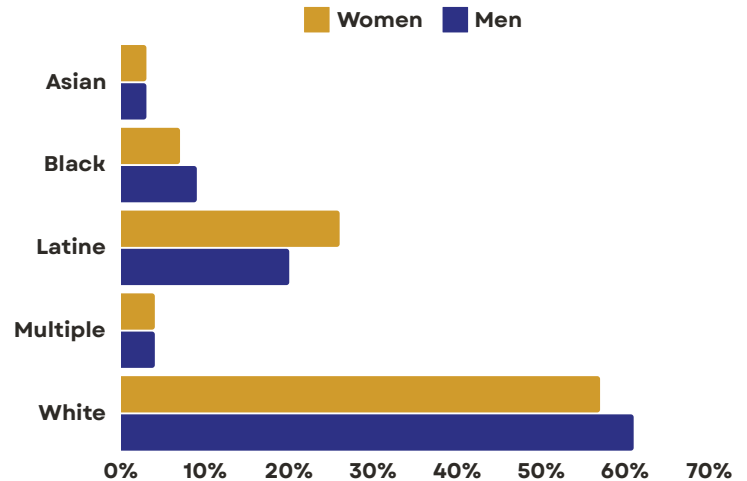

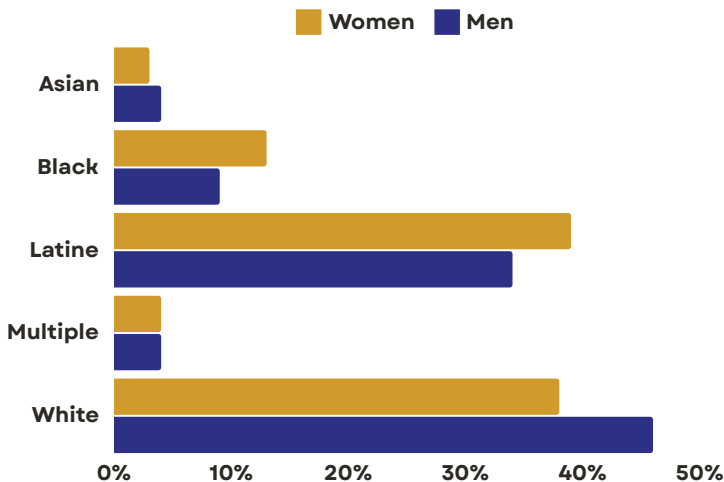

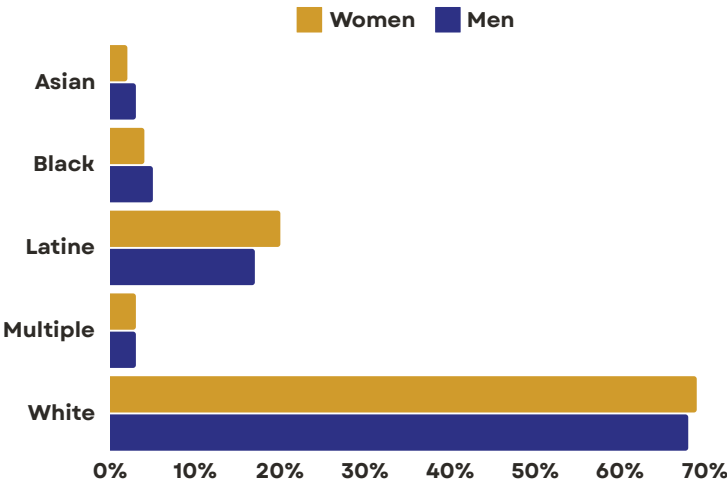

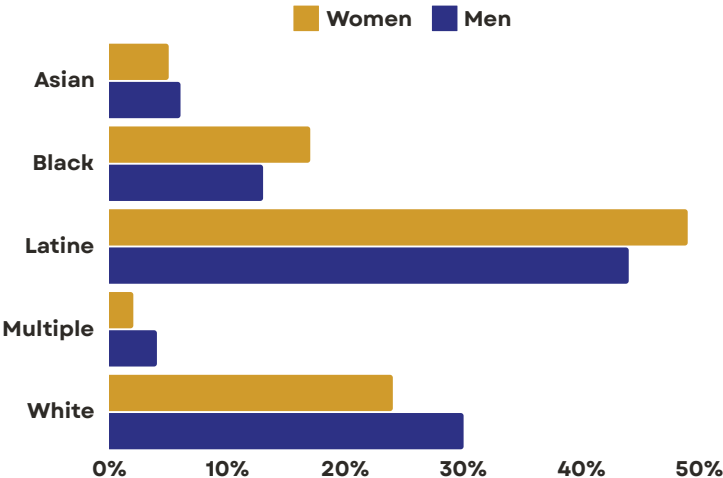

Credit Enrollment by Course Modality

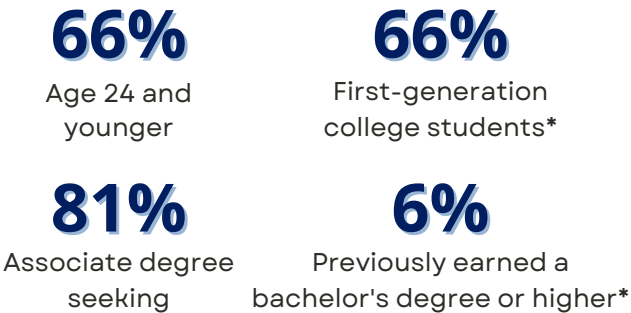

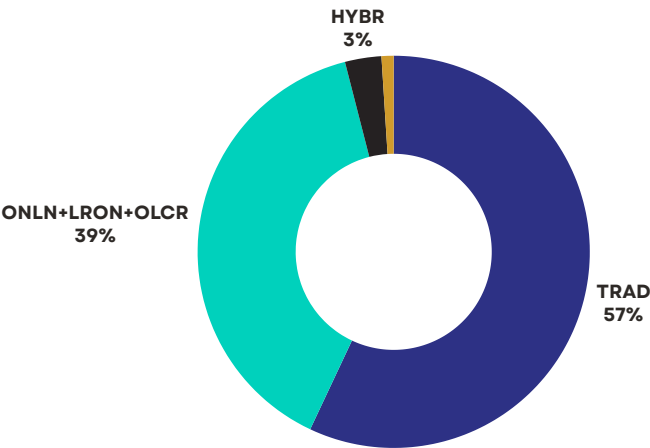

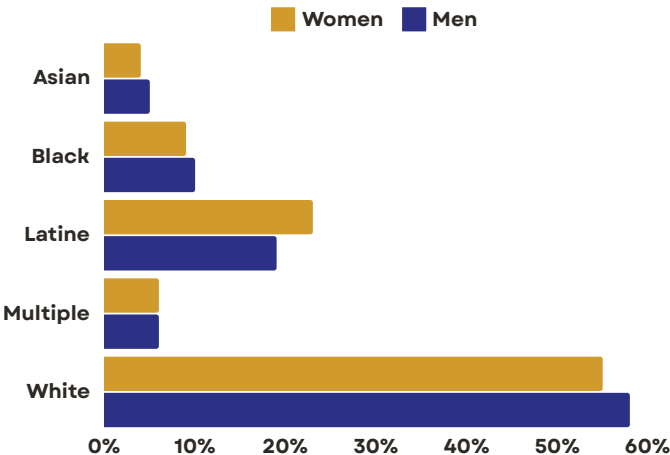

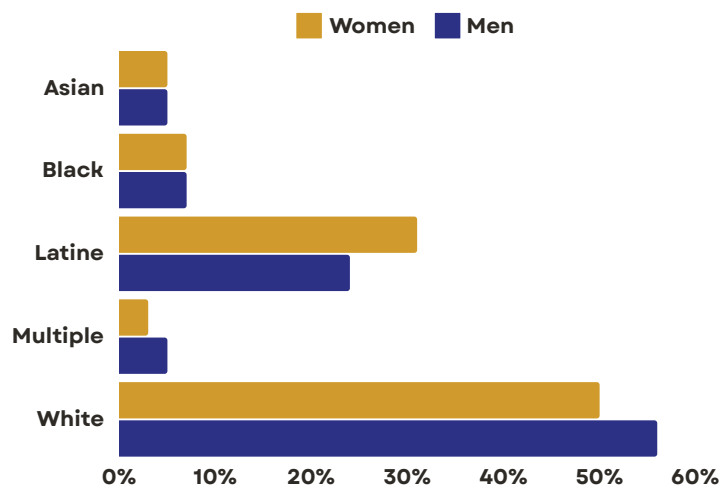

Glossary

Bachelor's Degree	An award (baccalaureate or equivalent degree) that requires at least four but not more than five years of full-time equivalent college-level work. Previously earned a bachelor's degree rates are based on students who responded to prior education questions on their application. In Sp24 81% of credit students had a valid response.
Degree level	Matriculated credit students are classified by their highest award level sought. Non-matriculated and secondary/dual-enrollment/College Career Pathways (CCP) students are included in the Non-Degree category.
Enrollment Level	Students taking 12 or more credits are full-time students; all other students are part-time students.
First-Generation	**Students who report neither parent earned a Bachelor's degree. Valid % based on students who responded to this question on their application. In Sp24, 88% of credit students had a valid response.
Seat Campus Full-Time Equivalent (FTE)	Total credit hours attempted divided by 15 for courses run at the specified campus (seat campus).
High School (HS) Dual Enrollment	Any student enrolled in secondary education who is taking credit courses prior to their high school graduation.
Home Campus Headcount	Total number of students designating (or assigned to) their home campus.
New, First-Time	Students attending for the first-time at the undergraduate level, as well as students enrolled for the Spring term who attended the same college for the first-time in the prior Winter term.
PACT	Pledge to Advance Connecticut, a last-dollar "Promise Program" designed to close the gap between other financial aid offers and the cost of tuition.
Race/Ethnicity	Students are grouped into race and ethnicity categories based on U.S. Office of Personnel Management classifications.
Readmitted	Students returning to the same college after an absence of at least two years.
Transfer-In	Students in their first CT State semester with a prior college listed on their admissions application.
