



Most CT State students are registered for less than 10 credits. Over Sp22, the number of **part-time students increased 4%**, while the number of **full-time students decreased by 2%**.

Despite enrollment gains made in 22-23 vs the prior academic year, CT state (like much of the nation) continues to be in a long-term enrollment decline.
























Over Sp22, the number of **part-time and full-time students increased by 6% and 3% respectively.**



Glossary

Continuing	Students registering for the current semester who were enrolled at the same college within the prior two years.
Degree level	Matriculated credit students are classified by their highest award level sought. Non-matriculated and secondary/dual-enrollment/College Career Pathways (CCP) students are included in the Non-Degree category.
First-Generation	Students whose parents did not attend any college or university. **neither parent earned a Bachelors degree.
Full-Time (FT) Student	A student registered for 12 credits or more in a given semester.
Full Time Equivalent (FTE)	Full-time equivalent enrollment is calculated as 15 undergraduate credit hours equals one FTE.
High School (HS) Dual Enrollment	Any student enrolled in secondary education who is taking credit courses prior to their high school graduation.
New First-Time	Students attending for the first-time at the undergraduate level, as well as students enrolled for the Fall term who attended the same college for the first time in the prior Summer or Winter term.
Outstanding Balance	The sum of student tuition and fees charges across all terms less payments, payment plan authorizations, anticipated loans, scholarships, aid and other memos.
PACT	Pledge to Advance Connecticut, a "free <u>community</u> college" student financial aid program.
Part-Time (PT) Student	A student registered for fewer than 12 credits in a given semester.
Race-Ethnicity	Multiple/Other/Unknown includes students who self-identified as American Indian or Alaskan Indian, Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander, two or more racial categories, and those who did not provide race/ethnicity information.
Readmitted	Students returning to the same college after an absence of at least two years.
Transfer-In	Students in their first CT State semester with a prior college listed on their admissions application.
