

Summary of CT State Shared Governance and Elections

<u>CT State Senate</u> – 3-year membership terms (staggered between 2024-27); via local campus elections.

<u>Membership</u>: To ensure adequate representation from all campuses the CT State College Senate will have a model that includes the same number of faculty and staff from each campus as well as non-management staff not affiliated with a specific campus and students:

- 12 voting FT Faculty members (1 from each campus)
- 13 voting FT Professional/Classified Staff members (1 from each campus and 1 not affiliated with a campus)
- 13 voting Non-Management "At-Large" members (1 from each campus and 1 not affiliated with a campus)

For this election, term lengths vary in order to establish staggered terms. In subsequent elections, terms will be for three-year terms and terms shorter than three years do not count towards term limits.

- The CT State President, or designee, will serve as an ex officio member.
- Senators are limited to serving 2 consecutive terms unless a campus fails to elect a Senator in regularly scheduled elections.

Campus shared governance leaders to hold elections for CT State Senate and report the results to co-collegesenate@ct.edu as soon as possible and prior to the April Senate Meeting on 4/26/24. The following information summarized from our recent adoptions, may be useful as you communicate this information with your campus and shared governance bodies and leadership.

Terms for Senators shall be for three years and Senators may serve a maximum of two consecutive terms. In order to establish staggered terms:

- Faculty Senators will be elected to a one-year term in April of 2024
- Staff Senators will be elected to a two-year term in April 2024
- At-large Senators will be elected to a 3-year term.

Campus governance leaders shall submit names, membership role, and contact information of newly elected Senators to Senate Elections Committee via email at co-collegesenate@ct.edu. <u>CT State Curriculum Congress</u> – 2-year membership (2024-26); via statewide elections. Voting Members (21+ members)

18+ voting FT tenure-track faculty members selected from across all schools of discipline and comprised of 3 statewide representatives from each school/program area in CT State.

In the event a campus is not represented among the elected faculty representatives, the campus governing body of the non-represented campus may select a faculty representative to serve as an atlarge voting member.

5 voting CCP/Staff members (1 from Advising, 1 from Registration, 1 from Library, 1 from Catalog office, and 1 CCP with direct curricular responsibilities)

The CT State Provost or designee will serve as an ex officio member.

The following positions will be a 1-year term for AY2024-25, followed by 2-year terms beginning AY2025-27 to implement staggered terms:

- 3 FT Faculty from Arts & Humanities
- 3 FT Faculty from Engineering & Technology
- 3 FT Faculty from Social & Behavioral Science
- 1 Staff from Advising
- 1 Staff from Library
- 1 Staff with Direct Curricular Responsibilities

The following positions will be 2-year terms, with the first being AY2024-26:

- 3 FT Faculty from Business & Hospitality
- 3 FT Faculty from Nursing & Health Careers
- 3 FT Faculty from Science & Mathematics
- 1 Staff from Registration
- 1 Staff from Catalog Office

The following positions will be 1-year terms, beginning AY2024-25.

1 FT Faculty representative from any campus not already represented by a Faculty member elected in a School area election.

CT State General Education Committee - Composition of the committee:

Voting Members (21 members) - via statewide elections and/or local campus elections.

- 1 FT Faculty or Staff rep per campus with general education assessment expertise (x12) elected locally at each campus. 2-year membership, elected in odd years (2023-25)
- 1 rep from each of the following Gen Ed Core Areas (x9) elected college-wide from any campus –
 2-year membership, elected in even years (2024-26)
 - 1 FT Faculty who teaches or has taught a course that is vetted for Written Communication
 - 1 FT Faculty who teaches or has taught a course that is vetted for Quantitative Reasoning

- 1 FT Faculty who teaches or has taught a course that is vetted for Arts & Humanities in the following disciplines: ART, ARTH, DGA, ESOL, GRA, HUM, MUS, PHIL, THEA, Language and Culture
- 1 FT Faculty who teaches or has taught a course that is vetted for Oral Communication
- 1 FT Faculty who teaches or has taught a course that is vetted for Scientific Knowledge & Understanding and/or Scientific Reasoning
- 1 FT Faculty who teaches or has taught a course that is vetted for Social & Behavioral Science
- 1 FT Faculty who teaches or has taught a course that is vetted for Historical Knowledge & Understanding
- 1 FT Librarian representing Continued Learning and Information Literacy 2-year membership (2024-26); via an election by statewide Librarians.
- 1 FT Faculty member of the Diversity, Equity, & Inclusion Committee (contingent on DEI being a course requirement in the Common Core) 2-year membership (2024-26); via an election by members of the Diversity, Equity, & Inclusion Committee.

Non-voting members (3 members) – 1-year membership; via statewide elections.

- 1 FT faculty member who teaches a course that is vetted for Creativity (additional Gen Ed in some CSCU Transfer Pathway degrees)
- 1 FT faculty member who teaches a course that is vetted for Global Knowledge (additional Gen Ed in some CSCU Transfer Pathway degrees)
- 1 FT Faculty who teaches or has taught a course that is vetted for Continued Learning,
 Information Literacy

Non-voting members (3 members) – 1-year membership; via statewide elections.

- 1 Enrollment Management / Registrar Staff
- 1 Guided Pathways / Advising Director Staff
- 1 Institutional Research & Effectiveness Staff

Non-voting members (4 members) – 1-year membership as appointed.

- 1 Director of Program Review and Assessment (ex officio)
- 1 CSCU Director of the Office of Transfer (ex officio)
- 1 2-year faculty lead of the "CSCU Gen Ed Alignment committee**" (which would report to CSCU Transfer Council) (ex officio)
- 1 Chair of the CT State Curriculum Congress (ex officio)

School Area Curriculum Committee (SACC) – 2-year membership (2024-26)

A guiding principle for School Area Curriculum Committee (SACC) membership is that there shall be one full-time faculty representative from each Academic School from each of the 12 campuses. This membership will include:

- 12 voting Faculty members (1 from each campus, representing each CT State School)
- 1 ex officio Academic Dean member (the Academic Dean from the applicable CT State School)

Statewide Discipline Council (SDC) – 2-year membership (2024-26)

Membership: A guiding principle for Statewide Discipline Council (SDC) membership is that there should berepresentation from each campus where discipline programming is available. This membership will include:

 Up to 12 full-time Faculty members (1 from each campus where discipline programming is available)

Important Dates:

March 22, 2024: Summary of Shared Governance and Elections will be shared with Governance Leadership.

March 26, 2024: Statewide Call for Self-Nominations is announced.

April 10, 2024: Deadline to submit Self-Nominations. Note: Only self-nominations are accepted; nominations of others are not permitted.

April 11, 2024: Balloting begins.

April 23, 2024: Balloting ends.

April 24, 2024: Results of campus and statewide elections are announced.
