



Current CT State Governance Process




Structural Changes that Require Endorsement

- Revise curriculum review timeline, which is currently too fast for Curriculum Congress but too slow in general
- Formalize campus shared governance roles including reporting to and working with both College Senate and Curriculum Congress
- Remove School Area Curriculum Committees (SACC)
- Implement more discipline-specific collegewide curriculum groups than the current SDCs
- Ensure local governance is functional and follows some general guidelines for purposes of enhancing communication to and from Senate
- Ensure all faculty in a discipline are consulted in a timely manner on relevant curriculum proposals



College Senate



- The composition of Senate includes 1 full-time faculty, 1 full-time staff, 1 at-large member from each of the 12 campuses, 2 from College Office, and 3 Students (41 Senators).
- No proposed changes.

Campus Governance

Option A (Default):


- No collegewide recommendations.
- Campuses may or may not have effective local governance bodies.

Option B (Campus Senates):

- Recommend that all campuses have an umbrella Campus Senate with majority membership consisting of faculty and staff, with faculty or staff leadership.
- Members of the College
 Senate should be ex officio or
 formal members of this body
 and report at regular meetings.
- Draft Bylaws will be provided for consideration.



Curriculum Issues

Curriculum Congress

A: 3 faculty reps/school + min 1/campus + misc. = 17+ reps

B: 4 faculty reps/school + min 1/campus + misc. = 21+ reps

Option A:

- 3 faculty representatives/school (shrinking from 6 to 4 schools) + 1 min/campus + misc. = 17+ reps
- There is no mechanism to prevent imbalanced membership (for example all STEM school reps could be from Math with 0 from Science or Engineering)

Option B:

- 4 faculty representatives/school (from 4 schools) + 1 min/campus + misc. = 21+ reps
- Restrictions to prevent imbalanced membership

 1 rep from each of 4 tobe-designated General Discipline Areas within each school


Curriculum Issues School Area Curriculum Committees (SACCs) A: Keep 4 SACCs B: Replace with Campus Curriculum Committees (CCC) C: Replace with **Curriculum Congress Development Meeting**

Option A: Keep 4 SACCs

Reduce from 6 to 4 to match new school structure

Option B: Campus Curriculum Committees (CCC)


- 12 Campus Curriculum Committees
- Composition TBD by campus, but includes members of Curriculum Congress from that campus



Curriculum Issues **School Area** Curriculum Committees (SACCs) A: Keep 4 SACCs B: Replace with Campus Curriculum Committees (CCC) C: Replace with **Curriculum Congress Development Meeting**

Option C: Curriculum Congress Development Meeting

- Local governance collects feedback as they prefer
- Extra meeting of Curriculum Congress earlier in the process (before 2nd SDC meeting)
- Fast track available for non-contentious proposals

Option A: No Changes (27 SDCs)

We have precedent to create new SDCs as needed

Option B: Restructure 27 SDCs into 50-100 CDCs

- College discipline Councils are like SDCs with 1 rep per campus, including local DCs/PCs where possible
- This also creates College Discipline Groups (CDGs)
 made up of ALL FT teaching courses with that discipline
 prefix(es), meeting 0-3 times per semester

B1: College Discipline Groups are for communication

B2: College Discipline Groups are for <u>approval</u>

- CDC rep would be for communication, not voting
- New Course Proposals need 2/3 vote of full CDG
- Modifications/discontinuations need >50% of full CDG
