Dr. Darryl Jones (he/him) began his tenure at Hudson County Community College (HCCC) in 2019. Located in Jersey City, New Jersey, HCCC is a Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI), serving more than 20,000 credit and noncredit students and supported by more than 400 teaching faculty.

As Vice President for Academic Affairs, Dr. Jones provides visionary leadership for the Journal Square and North Hudson Campuses; the College Libraries; the Center for Online Learning; the Center for Teaching, Learning, and Innovation; the Honors Program, the Office of Open Education Resources (OER), and the Abegail Douglas-Johnson Academic Support Services Department.
