

Shiang-Kwei Wang, Ph.D. (University of Georgia), is the Vice President of Academic Affairs and Provost at Hostos Community College. As the chief academic and student affairs officer, Dr. Wang plays a pivotal role in setting and advancing the college's vision for academic success, while ensuring the integration of key institutional operations in collaboration with other senior leadership team members. An accomplished academic leader and skilled administrator, Dr. Wang works closely with the college president, senior administrators, faculty, staff, CUNY Central, and the community to promote quality, adaptability, and equity in all

academic endeavors. She serves as the principal investigator for multiple private, federal, and state grants, including awards from the National Science Foundation, Department of Education, and the Illinois Community College Board. Dr. Wang was also the PI of Bank of America's TechQuity grant, which addressed equity issues in Chicago's workforce training programs.

Before joining Hostos, Dr. Wang served as Vice President of Academic and Student Affairs at Harold Washington College (City Colleges of Chicago), Dean for Research at Queensborough Community College (City University of New York), and Associate Dean of the School of Interdisciplinary Studies and Education at New York Institute of Technology (NYIT), where she was also a Professor and Chair of the Instructional Technology Program. A tenured full professor at NYIT, Dr. Wang taught both graduate and undergraduate courses and served on numerous professional organization committees.

As a renowned scholar in the field of educational technology, she focuses her research on STEM education, cognitive tools and pedagogical practice. Dr. Wang has been invited to present on pedagogical practices for adopting generative artificial intelligence technology at multiple conferences and to conduct workshops. She was recently honored with the United Federation of Fil-Am Educators' Outstanding Leadership in Education Award and was named to *City & State*'s 2024 **Power of Diversity: Asian 100** list, which recognizes Asian leaders who have made significant contributions to New York City.
